

DISPOSAL RULES

FIND and PACK

- Put on gloves and find a strong cardboard box or plastic container.
- Wherever possible keep chemicals in their original containers. *DO NOT MIX CHEMICALS.*
- Ensure containers are clearly labelled and well sealed. If you do not know the contents, label the container 'UNKNOWN CHEMICAL'.
- Wrap containers holding liquids and solids securely in newspaper, place in sturdy plastic bags and store in box.
- Consult the collection timetable and come on the day.

MOVE and DROP OFF

Drop-off sites will accept household quantities, up to a maximum container size of 20 lt or 20 kg per item.

We advise against children and pets accompanying you in the car.

- Put your box or containers in the boot and drive carefully with the windows down.
- Take your products to any collection site near you, follow directions and stay in your car.
- Let the collector remove your products.



We WILL accept

- All household horticultural chemicals such as pesticides and herbicides
- All cleaning chemicals from the kitchen, laundry, shed and garage
- Fuels, lubricants, coolants, brake and transmission fluid
- Gas cylinders
- All batteries
- Paint, solvents and thinners
- Fertiliser
- Photographic chemicals
- Poisons
- Fluoro tubes and compact fluoro globes
- Aerosol cans
- Pharmaceuticals
